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

Myoporum bateae was named for Mary Bate, who collected the type specimens. Mary collected over 350 specimens in total – including fungi, algae and mosses – around Mount Dromedary and Tilba Tilba in New South Wales. She was one of at least 225 women throughout Australia who collected botanical specimens for Ferdinand von Mueller.



Muelleria publishes research papers on Southern Hemisphere plant, algal and fungal taxonomy and systematics, particularly relating to Australia. Acceptable submissions include: taxonomic revisions; phylogenetic and biogeographical studies; short papers describing new taxa, documenting nationally significant new records, or resolving nomenclatural matters; historical analyses relevant to systematics; and any research contributing to our knowledge of plant, algal or fungal diversity. Special issues or reviews will be considered after discussion with the Editor.

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MUELLERIA INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Submission. The Editor, *Muelleria*
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Papers may be submitted at any time.

Submit all material, including illustrations and tables, on CD or by email. Each figure and table should be supplied as a separate file. Vouchers for new species or for molecular or ecological research must be lodged at the time of submission. All papers are peer reviewed and should not be under consideration elsewhere. No page charges apply for black-and-white pages. Colour plates will only be considered after discussion with the Editor, and may incur a charge.

Formatting. Manuscripts should be left-aligned with 1.5 line-spacing throughout, and left and right margins of 2 cm. Body text should be 10 pt Times New Roman. All text should be in the font in which it will be published, i.e. **bold** or *italics*.

Title. The title should be concise and informative, and formatted in 12 pt, centred, bold type. Use minimal capitalisation.

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Abstract. Precede the main text by an abstract not exceeding 120 words, covering the scope of the work and findings. All new names and combinations made in the paper must be explicitly given in the abstract. Taxon names at genus rank or below must be accompanied by the nomenclatural authorities.

Key words. Provide 3–5 key words that are not used in the title.

Main text. The first paragraph of any section should be flush left. Subsequent paragraphs are to be indented, and not separated by a blank line. Three main headings should be used:

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
